Pupils in secondary schools across Sutton and Croydon have received their GCSE results as they make their next steps into the next stage of their education.

Some of the Sutton schools

some of the Sutton Schools celebrating good grades included Overton Grange School, which saw one of its best sets of results in the school's history, with 75 per cent of pupils achieving a grade 4 standard pass or above in all subjects - in-

cluding English and mathematics.

16 students got nine or more grades between 7 and 9 (A or A**), another two obtained six or more grade 9s

Carshalton High School for Girls saw more than 60 per cent of pupils achieve a good pass in five subjects – including English and mathematics. Almost 50 per cent of grades were awarded in all subjects which are grades 9 to 5 (A** - C)
At Sutton High School, more than

21 per cent of grades were at grade 9 (A**), with 55 per cent between grades 7 to 9.

In English, 30 per cent of pupils got a grade 9, and in religious stud-ies 78 per cent obtained grades be-tween 7 and 9. In STEM subjects, 65 and 56 per cent of chemistry and biology pupils achieved what were the old A* and A grades, and in his-tory, this figure was 82 per cent. At Nonsuch High School for Girls,

At nonsuch high School for Girls, more than 62 per cent of pupils achieved grades at a level between 9 and 8 (A** - A*), and 83 per cent between 9 and 7 (A** - A), with the number of grades between 9 and 6 (A**, B) at 93.4 per cent, while four pupils got grade 9 in every single subject they sat.

Among Croydon schools, Trinity

School celebrated 68 per cent of grades awarded being at A*, 9 or 8, when last year 58 per cent of grades

John Fisher School saw a strong performance at the highest grades, as 21 per cent of all exam entries received A*/A (7, 8 or 9).

Woodcote High School in Couls-

don saw almost three-quarters of

don saw almost three-quarters of grades at a pass or above.

At Archbishop Tenison's Church of England High School, a total of 84 per cent of pupils achieved a 4+ grade in English language and 73 per cent in maths. 70 per cent of pupils achieved a 5+ in English language and 53 per cent in maths.

Coloma Convent Girls' School saw 44 per cent of grades at grades.

saw 44 per cent of grades at grade saw 44 per cent or graces at grade 7 or higher, equivalent to an A or A* last year, with 23 per cent of the grades being either an 8 or a 9. Harris Academy Crystal Palace had 80 per cent of students achieved

at least five GCSEs including English and maths, while at Harris Academy South Norwood and Harris Academy Upper Norwood, 84 per cent of students gained GCSEs in English and 70 per cent in maths while 33

per cent of students achieved the demanding English baccalaureate. At Oasis Academy Shirley Park, 55 per cent of students achieved a

55 per cent of students achieved a 4 or above in English and maths this year and 35 per cent achieved the higher level 5 in both subjects.
Croydon High School had more than 30 per cent of numbered grades awarded to Croydon High girls at the top Grade 9, while more than 50 per cent of all grades awarded at GCSE graded A*, 8 or 9.
At Quest Academy, 65 per cent of all results were Grade 4+ or C+with a larcer number of subjects

with a larger number of subjects than ever before seeing their cohorts meet or surpass this figure.

Six out of ten students achieved five GCSEs between grades 9 and 4 including English and Maths.
