School Closure

You may have heard the Prime Minister's announcement earlier this evening that schools across the UK will close at the end of the day on Friday in order to better manage the impact of the Coronavirus. We have been expecting this and now need to implement our plans for school closure.

We will commence our Remote Learning Plan (shared with you earlier today) on Monday, 23rd March 2020 and the Quest Academy site will be closed to students after the end of the day on Friday.

Until then, students who are able to attend school should continue to do so, as normal. Unless specifically indicated, students should not come to the Quest Academy for any reason after Friday until advised otherwise.

On Monday staff will begin uploading tasks to Show My Homework for students to complete. Please check all login and access issues before Friday.


For students who may have difficulties in accessing work online, Subject Learning Packs have been prepared and will be distributed before the end of this week to those students who request them.

Summer Exams


The Prime Minister announced this evening that GCE and GCSE examinations would not take place in May and June, as scheduled. Although he gave a commitment to ensuring that students would be awarded with the qualifications they deserve, there has not yet been any further detail as to how this will happen. At this stage, despite this unsettling development, it is important that students in Year 11 and Year 13 continue to focus on their studies and follow the advice of their teachers. I suspect that Ofqual will make an announcement soon and we will update students and parents accordingly, as soon as we have further details.

Children of Key Workers & More Vulnerable Children

Despite school closure, schools are being asked to make provision for children whose parents are "key workers" in order to support them in being able to continue to go to work, and also more vulnerable children, e.g. those who are supported by a social worker or have an EHCP. We will contact parents separately to ascertain how many students we have who would fit these descriptions and whether or not parents would want to make use of such provision. The responses will help us to plan appropriately.

Parents and students can continue to email staff, as well, with any particular queries or concerns and Tutors should remain the first point of contact for pastoral queries.
